

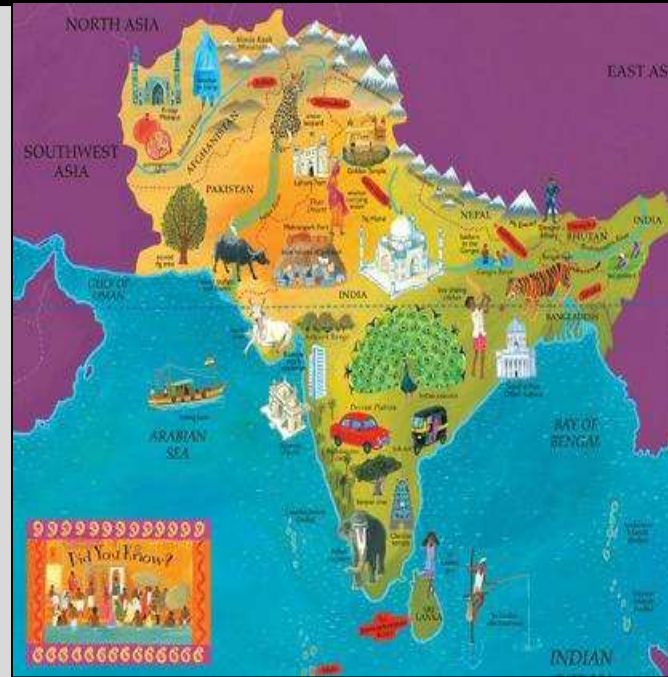
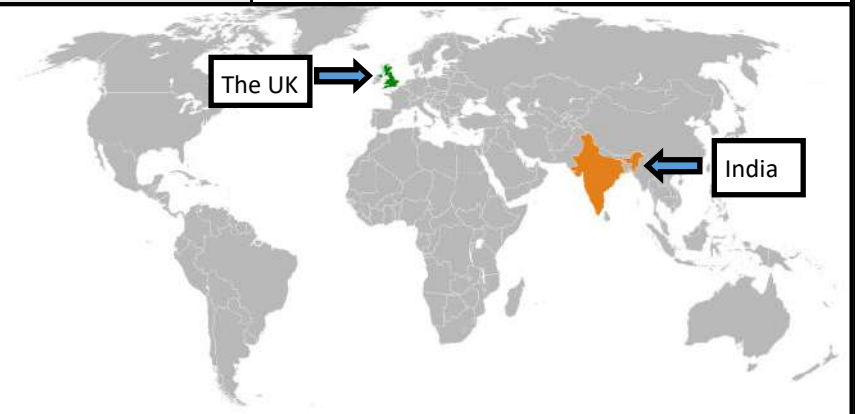

Key Vocabulary:	
Local area	The area around where you live.
Aerial view	What somewhere would look like from above looking down.
Fieldwork	Working outside to collect information
City	A place in which people live and work which is bigger than a town.
Town	An area with streets, houses, and buildings that is larger than a village but usually smaller than a city.
Village	A small town or community, often in the country.
Culture	The 'way of life' of a country or group of people e.g. tradition, dress, language, religion.
Climate	What the weather is like over a long period of time.
Landmarks	Important objects or features of the landscape.
Population	The number of people living in a place.
Weather	The conditions outside on a given day, including temperature and rainfall.



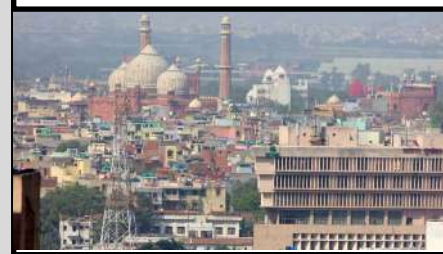
Key Facts:

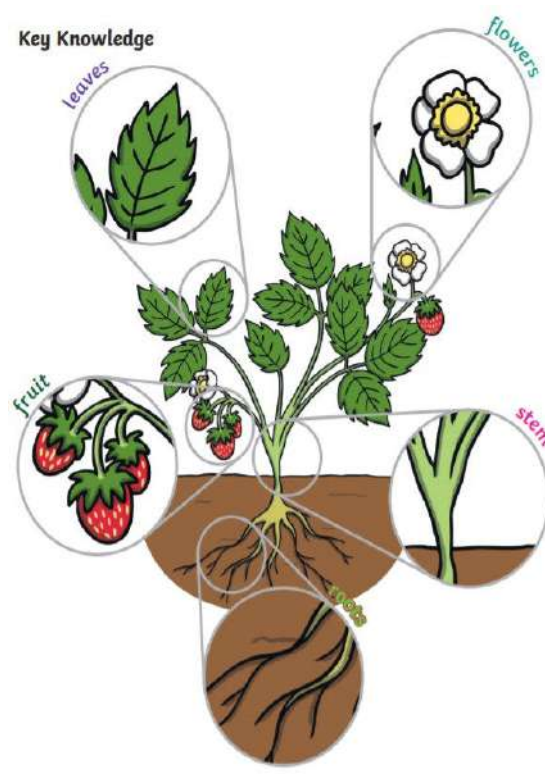

## Year 1– Science: Plants



### Key Vocabulary:

Roots	Roots rake in water and nutrients from the soil.
Stem	The stem holds the plant up and carries the water and nutrients from the roots to the leaves and flowers.
Leaves	Leaves catch sunlight to make energy.
Flowers	Flowers attract insects and birds.
Blossom	A blossom is a flower that grows on stone fruit trees and other plants.
Petals	Petals are the colourful part of the flower.
Fruit	Fruit contains the plant's seeds.
Seed	Seeds grow into new plants.
Bulb	Bulbs grow into new plants.
Deciduous	A deciduous tree loses its leaves every year.
Evergreen	An evergreen tree keeps its green leaves all year round, even in the winter.
